THE FALMOUTH UNIVERSITY HARDSHIP FUND IS DESIGNED TO HELP STUDENTS WHO HAVE ENCOUNTERED **UNFORESEEN** FINANCIAL PROBLEMS DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR. THE ASSESSMENT WILL CONSIDER YOUR INCOME, OUTGOINGS AND ORIGINAL FINANCIAL PLAN AT THE POINT OF ENROLMENT TO THE ACADEMIC YEAR.

Questions in the application form

How did you plan to fund this academic year of study?

It is expected that students will only enrol on a course with a robust financial plan in place. Briefly explain how you planned to pay for all of your costs through the academic year. We'd expect all known pre-existing costs to be covered. It is also the students' responsibility to be clear on their eligibility status with Student Finance prior to enrolment.

What annual income are you currently receiving from student finance?

Typically for students from England, this will be the total amount received in Maintenance Loan. Students from outside of England, should quote the equivalent total of maintenance support received. Do not include your Tuition Fee Loan in this section.

What annual income are you currently receiving from your parents and or household?

If you're receiving less than full support from Student Finance (approximately £9,200pa), then it's expected that your household will contribute towards your costs. Please state how much is received from your household for the whole year.

What annual income are you currently receiving from Falmouth University (ie. bursaries)?

Please total any/all bursaries and awards you expect to receive from the university this year (Falmouth Bursary, Materials Award, Cornwall Award etc). If unsure, leave blank.

What annual income are you currently receiving from other sources (e.g private funding)

If you are receiving sponsorship or funding from any other source, please state the amount received here.

What annual income are you currently receiving from part time employment?

It is expected that most 1st and 2nd year students will work part-time (up to 12 hours per week). Please state how much you earn from such work over the academic year. If you do not work, please detail this in your Support Statement.
